Garbage Containers



Every homeowner is required to own a city approved garbage container. The City has available 64 or 96-gallon containers. You can purchase your garbage container by stopping at City Hall located at 106 W. Pleasant Street. You can pay the entire amount or pay by twelve (12) equal monthly payments to be included on your monthly utility bill. Homeowners may purchase their own garbage container but they have to be a tipper cart, have an attached lid, meet the physical requirements to allow for dumping via mechanical capabilities, and attach to the city garbage truck. All garbage containers must be approved by the City through the utility/finance office at 356-2141. All bagged garbage must fit in the garbage container. If you need additional containers, please let the City utility/finance office know.

Rubble Site

Open every Wednesday, 5pm to 7pm, every Saturday, 9am to 5pm.

Recycling Center

Located east of the water treatment plant, corner of Main & Jackson Streets. Open every Monday & Thursday, 5pm to 7pm.

Farmers Market

Every Tuesday from 5:30pm to 7pm at City Hall parking lot, 106 W. Pleasant Street.

Off Street Parking

(City Ordinance No. 367, Section 11:04)

All travel trailers, trailers and recreational vehicles shall be parked or stored behind the Right-Of-Way when they are to remain stationary. Travel trailers, trailers, and recreational vehicles which are to remain stationary shall be owned by the owner/occupant of the property and shall not serve as temporary or permanent sleeping quarters for any person for more than seven (7) days within a thirty (30) consecutive day period.

Tree Branch Trimming

It is the duty of any person or persons owning or occupying real property bordering on any street upon which property there may be trees, to prune such trees in such manner that they will not obstruct or shade the street lights, obstruct the passage of pedestrians on sidewalks, obstruct vision of traffic signs, or obstruct view of any street or alley intersections, except where such services are provided for by utility firms. The minimum clearance of any overhanging portion shall be ten (10) feet over all sidewalks and fourteen (14) feet over all streets (City Ordinance: 6.0502).

Thanks for taking time and effort to make our streets and sidewalks safe.
